July 11, 2019 - The EAA Young Eagles program achieved a major milestone on June 28, as 60,000 Young Eagles have now enrolled in the Sporty's Learn to Fly Course.

The Glenn Curtiss Museum



My business travels took me to the Southern Tier of New York, last month. I happened to be passing Hammondsport, NY just as the day was ending and with an hour to tour the Glenn Curtiss Museum. The museum is focused on Hammondsport's favorite son, Glenn Curtiss, but also many other locals who added to the town's history and industry. There is a lot of information about experimental aviation that took place in the 1920's, under the direction of Alexander Graham Bell and Glenn Curtiss. Flying boats were popular among Curtiss designs, no doubt from being in the Finger Lakes Region. Also interesting are the many motorcycles of Glenn Curtiss. Curtiss Jenny's and the barnstorming era is also on full display, as is the Curtiss P40 Warhawk and use by The Flying Tigers.
